1) Online Student Conference Outline

This online student conference (Winter 2021) is part of the Campus Asia initiative which focuses on the field of post-pandemic cooperation in East Asia. With COVID-19 restricting student mobility, our online conference is the second trial among three universities to explore the potential and variety of online program.

Against the background, our “Online Student Conference” aims at providing an opportunity for students from Peking University, Seoul National University and the University of Tokyo to study the conventional cooperation styles in East Asia and share their ideas on the current and prospect post-pandemic cooperation in economy, political and culture, etc. Through participating in this online conference and free discussion process, students will have a stronger appreciation on the East Asia cooperation and gain hands-on experience of being exposed to international lectures via online. Providing platforms for students to discuss complex issues is also an indispensable part of university education so that students could deepen mutual understanding.

2) Conference Details

The student conference takes place on 1 and 5 February, 2020 and the entire process will be conducted online. All the conference attendees will be the students and faculty members of Peking University, Seoul National University and the University of Tokyo. Each university is expected to select 8 students to attend the conference and the total 24 students will be divided into 6 groups ahead with 4 students in each group. (NOTE: Each student group will have at least one student from each university) Students will have interactive, free group discussions ahead of and on the Day 1.

Biography: GUI Yongtao is a Vice President of the Institute of International and Strategic Studies(IISS), Associate Dean and Associate Professor at the School of International Studies(SIS) in Peking University(PKU).

He received his PhDs from Waseda University and Peking University in 2005 through a double-degree program. His research focuses on politics and international relations of East Asia. His recent publications include *The Politics of TPP: The Motivation and Predicament of U.S.-Japan Cooperation* (2017), *Changes in American Perceptions and Policies towards Japan* (2014), *The Rise of Nationalism in East Asia and the Changing Relations between China and its Neighbors* (2013), *China-Japan-US Relations and Northeast Asia's Evolving Security Architecture* (2010).
